

Book a Holiday

3) How much is left to pay? 4) One week before the first date, you need to pay 50% if the balance owed. How much will you need to pay?




5) How much is left to pay on arrival?



Arrival Guidelines

As Kynren is a night show, the timing of each performance varies as the season progresses and the days get shorter, to ensure each performance takes place in darkness so that the special lighting and pyrotechnics are set off to greatest effect. Please check the specific start time of your chosen show.

Venue opens at:	6.00pm	5.30pm	5.00pm
Make your way to Kynren from your car park/drop off point by:	6.30pm	6.00pm	5.30pm
Arrive at security and ticket check by:	7.00pm	6.30pm	6.00pm
Make your way to your seat at:	8.30pm	8.00pm	7.30pm
Showtime:	9.30pm	9.00pm	8.30pm



Task: Your performance begins at 9.30pm, when darkness falls. Your log cabin is a 15 minute drive from Kynren. 6) To be at the front of the queue, what time do you need to leave? 7) How long will it be from leaving your cabin to the performance beginning?

Walk from the town centre straight into the beautiful grounds of the magnificent **Auckland Castle**, the country residence of the Prince Bishops for more than 900 years. www.aucklandcastle.org

Surrounding the Castle are the 800 acres of the **Bishop's Deer Park** - a great place for a summer picnic or an autumnal stroll through vividly coloured parkland.

Bishop Auckland's historic town centre has a thriving arts and cultural offering, with the **Bishop Auckland Town Hall** home to a superb library, cinema, theatre and arts complex.

The town has more than 200 shops - head for **Bondgate** for boutiques and specialist shops that you won't find on the high street
